Binghamton University Summer Research Immersion 2017: This program provides students intending to major in the STEM fields with a one-of-a-kind research experience. It offers a stepped, multi-mentored, team-based experience that is ideal for students with little, if any, research experience. For Summer 2017, the program is offering four research streams: Biomedical Chemistry, Image & Acoustic Signals Analysis (Computer Science), Microbial Biofilms in Human Health (Microbiology), and Molecular & Biomedical Anthropology (studying Lyme disease).

NSF-Summer Research Experiences for Undergraduates (REU) in Computational Neuroscience:

The Computational Neurobiology Center at the University of Missouri is currently seeking applications for a 9 week research experience in summer 2017. Participants will receive a stipend of \$4,500 in addition to travel, tuition, dorm housing and a full meal plan. The REU includes an opportunity to assist grad students with important research led by leading faculty, a course in Computational Neuroscience, a full series of evening workshops and brown bag lunches, culminating in a Research Symposium. Students from underrepresented groups are encouraged to apply.
